Pre-teach

In the extract that you will read from the SSAT's publication 'Redesigning Schooling 3: Principled curriculum design', you will come across the following key concepts and terminology, so we have provided a brief explanation of what they mean to support your understanding.

21st century skills

A term that is used to refer to the skills that are necessary to be successful in today's global economy. There is no single widely accepted definition of what '21st Century skills' are.

Spiral curriculum

A curriculum model proposed by Jerome Bruner (1960) where learning is visualised as a spiral from basic to advanced concepts, with topics being revisited at increasing levels of complexity.

Situational interest

A term used to describe the psychological state characterised by increased attention, effort and affect, experienced in a particular moment.
