• As always, the starting point for this Development Cycle is the short retrieval quiz which we ask you to complete on Brightspace. The quiz will help you to identify any areas within the programme that you are unsure of.



Your mentor

Mentor interaction

- By now, you will be used to the structure of the Development Cycle, in which your mentor plays a crucial role. At the start of the Development Cycle, you should identify (through completing Retrieval Quiz 6, and discussing this with your mentor) an area of your practice on which you are going to focus for the next half-term.
- With your mentor, you should then identify a colleague who is particularly skilled in your chosen area for development. You must then arrange to observe their practice. Following your observation, you then need to meet with your mentor to deconstruct what you have seen and discuss how you might adapt and apply this best practice to your own teaching. In the remaining weeks of the Development Cycle, your mentor will drop-in regularly to see how your practice is developing and to provide you with the support and guidance you need.
- · You will also continue with your fortnightly mentor meetings.

ECT Development Cycle 6 seminar

- The focus of your Development Cycle 6 seminar is developing a coherent curriculum.
- In the seminar you will:
 - explore common curriculum pitfalls and how to avoid these
 - recap the importance of a sequenced curriculum to build secure mental models
 - review a subject-specific example of a foundational concept and how and when it is revised and built on, and
 - practice sequencing a concept within your own curriculum.

Induction tutors

- ECTs may wish to share what they have leamt in their Development Cyde more broadly with staff to value their research and share good practice. This is not a requirement. We are aware that some schools are engaging with this model and the feedback has been great to hear.

- Seminar attendance: Thank you for reminding your ECTs and mentors that seminar attendance is compulsory. This is a funded part of their training and, unless there are exceptional circumstances (such as illness, parents' evenings and residential trips). To help with this, all seminar dates are published well in advance, but we are sadly having an increasing numbers of ECTs contacting us to say they cannot attend due to sporting fixtures etc. If there are exceptional circumstances, ECTs and mentors should notify you, their seminar facilitator and the Xavier central team. We will then be able to offer ECTs and/or mentors an alternative training taking place on a different date, or (when this is not available) send out catch-up materials. Training is an entitlement for both ECTs and mentors and we are very grateful for your support in ensuring that all programme members receive that entitlement
- **Updated guidance from the DfE** As of September 2023, ECT/mentor meetings will be expected to be timetabled during teaching hours as schools are funded to cover the time off timetable. In **exceptional circumstances**, where schools require flexibility due to timetabling constraints, mentoring may take place outside of teaching hours but should always be scheduled within contracted time.





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Message to your induction tutor (continued)

End of year 2 final assessments: The end of the summer term will be the last term of induction for most ECT 2s. This means they will have their final, formal assessment, which they need to pass in order to be regarded by the DfE/TRA as having successfully passed induction. If, when you are reading this, you have any hint of a concern that an ECT is not performing satisfactorily against the Teachers' Standards, and you would not feel happy to sign off on the following statement, please let Sophie Hunter (s.hunter@xaviercet.org.uk) know immediately.

The teacher named above has performed satisfactorily against the Teachers' Standard for the completion of induction.

It is important to note that, under current legislation, ECTs have only <u>one</u> opportunity to pass induction:

"An ECT has only one chance to complete statutory induction. An ECT who has completed induction, and is judged to have failed to meet the Teachers' Standards at the end of their induction period, is not permitted to repeat induction (although they may appeal against the decision). While such an ECT does not lose their QTS, they cannot be employed lawfully as a teacher in a relevant school, including any post where they would carry out specified work. Their name is included on the list of persons, held by the Teaching Regulation Agency, who have failed to satisfactorily complete an induction period." (DfE, 2021, Induction for Early Career Teachers (England), paragraph 1.12)
